



Collection of data on national POLITICAL SCIENTISTS

- Political Scientists in HIGHER EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS and PUBLIC RESEARCH INSTITUTES
- Criteria for defining “political scientist”:

When available: **a legal criteria used to define political scientists** (e.g. national accreditation schemes; ministerial definitions/regulations)

When official /legal criteria **do not exist**:

- I. Institutional affiliation *or* PhD in Political Science *and*
- II. Research record *or* teaching activities

Where for:

- I. INSTITUTIONAL AFFILIATION: member of departments/institutes of political science, political studies, international relations, public administration, public policy, political theory (and also, eventually, departments / faculties / schools or institutes of neighbouring institutions like European studies, law, area studies, geography, economy, sociology, psychology, management, communication, history, environmental and health sciences, etc.)
- II. RESEARCH RECORD: we suggest considering national or international journals in political science, public policy, public administration; international relations, political theory, EU and area studies.

TEACHING ACTIVITIES: *at least half teaching workload in political science* courses/modules that are primarily part of an accredited political science program (the following keywords might give some guidance to identify relevant fields: International, global, world **AND** political, institution, international relations, politics, affairs, organization, trade, history, theory, economy, any relevant country, crisis, governance + politics, political, policy, government, governance, nation, nationalism, political institutions/regime(s)/system(s); conflict, democracy/democratic, diplomacy, elections, electoral system, foreign, Europe, EU, ideology, legislative, parliament, peace, public, security, political economy, parties, power, social movement, state, voting, public management, public administration, public sector).
